Kelpies Canter sponsored walk for Christian Aid on Saturday 16th September from 10.30 – 12.30

The organization of this event (the first since Covid restrictions were imposed in 2019) is now being done locally by Christian Aid volunteers as the focus for the reduced number of CA employees is now visiting churches and organizations to raise awareness of the work of Christian Aid rather than being directly involved in fund raising events. As the Bridge Walks are no longer taking place, we thought it was important to try to re-establish the Kelpie Canter Walk as an annual event in the Falkirk area. We continue to receive advice and support from C.A. to make this event happen.

NEEMA PROJECTS - TRANSFORMING COMMUNITIES ONE LIFE AT A TIME.

On Sunday 16th July Jayne Lamont joined our special Hags 183rd Birthday celebrations service to tell us about the work of the charity NEEMA, the Swahili word for Grace, that she set up in 2018 to support vulnerable women and children in Kenya.

Jayne gave a moving testimony about how on a visit to Kenya she saw families living in need of medical care, school provision and a regular source of income, along with the conviction that God was calling her to do what she could to raise funds to support this work.

Jayne made a commitment to send financial support on a regular basis to partners who were working in Kenya on local projects to provide basic health care, support widows to start a business and to help young people in schools with textbooks, PE equipment, clean drinking water and even basic essentials, like soap, and feminine hygiene products.

Sometimes Jayne was unsure if she would be able to continue making these regular financial contributions and she is so grateful for God's gracious provision, through the partnership of all who have contributed to this vital work with prayer, financial support, and other material gifts. NEEMA is now providing feminine hygiene products for 100 girls each month and in December 2022 began supplying drinking water to Kosogo Primary School, each month, saving the children a walk of several miles each day.

Following the service, a delicious 'Birthday Tea' was provided for the congregation and our friends from Denny Old Church. The fellowship, sandwiches and cakes were enjoyed by everyone and our guests, Jayne and her family, were able to talk informally about the work of NEEMA and share photos of the families being supported in Kenya.

Jayne was overwhelmed by the warm welcome and generosity shown towards her and the NEEMA Kenyan Projects. The amazing donation of £691.65 given by the joint congregations will go a long way, touching and changing lives. (Proverbs 19:17)

New Beginnings

As someone whose career was spent in education, I always see August as a time for 'New Beginnings'. All those fresh unused jotters, perfectly sharpened pencils and stiff (if somewhat uncomfortable!), new uniforms and shoes were a sign that a new school year had started, and new possibilities were beckoning. This time of the year therefore always offered exciting new opportunities but also the frightening unknown.

This is where we are now in the process of putting into practice the 'Mission Plan' for this area that was negotiated between representatives from Bonnybridge, Denny, Dunipace and Haggs churches over the past months.

We are excited by the prospect of eventually amalgamating five churches into one large parish, with more people and finances to take forward the work of the Lord in this area, and to build stronger links to the wider community. However, the thought of losing buildings and firm relationships within our own 'church family' here at Haggs is a scary prospect for many of us.

When Presbytery endorse the plan submitted from this area, then a Steering group will be formed to represent the congregations from each church. They will take the process of change through at a steady pace with consultation with members and elders at each step. They will need everyone's support and prayers as they take forward future developments for radically changing church worship here at Haggs.

We will all need to remember the words of a well-known hymn that we all sang as children:-

The Church is wherever God's people are praising, Singing their thanks for joy on this day.

The Church is wherever disciples of Jesus remember his story and walk in his way.

The Church is wherever God's people are helping, caring for neighbours in sickness and need.
